TROPHIES AND AWARDS FOR MODEL BUILDING

Awards will only be made where at least 50% of the available marks have been gained.

1.0 Auckland American Modellers Group Trophy

This is the supreme award for all Categories. (Scratch built and Kit Based.)

Awarded to the model gaining the highest percentage of possible marks during judging.

TROPHIES AND AWARDS FOR SCRATCHBUILDING

Entries in the NZAMRC Scratch Building competitions are eligible for the following awards and trophies.

2.1 NZMR Guild Cup.

Awarded for the model of a New Zealand prototype that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging. (Categories 2.1 to 2.12)

2.2 Christchurch MRC Anniversary Cup.

Awarded for the entry that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging. (Categories 2.1 to 2.12)

2.3 Stoker Model Trophy.

Awarded for the entry that best exhibits excellence and originality in craftsmanship in any category. (Decided on the Skill factor (Clause 3.1) only.)

2.4 William H Reddick Memorial Award.

Awarded for the model of a British prototype that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging. (Categories 2.1 to 2.12)

2.5 Bob Stevens Memorial Trophy.

Awarded for the entry in any modelling category and built by a modeller under 18 years of age at the date of the convention that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging. (Categories 2.1 to 2.12)

2.6 W W Stewart Memorial Trophy.

Awarded for the model of a New Zealand prototype locomotive built to a scale of 1:64 that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging. (Category 2.1)

2.7 Warren Cunningham Memorial Award.

Awarded for the model of a New Zealand prototype within categories 2.2, 2.3 and 2.4 built to a scale of 1:64 that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging.

2.8 Hank Edwards Memorial Trophy.

Awarded for the model of a European prototype that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging. ("European" refers to continental Europe and excludes Britain and Ireland.) (Categories 2.1 to 2.12)

2.9 John Pfahlert Memorial Trophy.

Awarded for the model of a New Zealand prototype within categories 2.6 to 2.12 built to a scale of 1:64 that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging.

TROPHIES AND AWARDS FOR KIT BASED MODELS

Entries in the NZAMRC Kit Based building competitions are eligible for the following awards and trophies

3.1 Scalecraft Trophy.

Awarded for the entry in the competition that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging. (Categories 2.1 to 2.12)

3.2 Eileen L Reddick Memorial Award.

Awarded for the model of a British prototype that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging. (Categories 2.1 to 2.12)

3.3 Peter Silbery Memorial Trophy.

Awarded for the entry in any modelling category and built by a modeller under 18 years of age at the date of the convention that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging. (Categories 2.1 to 2.12)

3.4 Ironhorse Hobbies Trophy.

Awarded for the model of a New Zealand prototype locomotive built to a scale of 1:64 that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging. (Category 2.1)

3.5 South Dock Models Trophy.

Awarded for the model of a New Zealand prototype within categories 2.2, 2.3 and 2.4 built to a scale of 1:64 that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging.

3.6 Wairarapa Railway Modellers Trophy.

Awarded for the model of a European prototype that gains the highest percentage of possible marks during judging. ("European" refers to continental Europe and excludes U.K. and Ireland.) (Categories 2.1 to 2.12)
